Chair's Opening Comments: Bonnie Heidler

Discussion about mobilizing teams to get out the vote.

Debate Watch: Some LD groups are getting together to watch the Democratic candidates debate. They are on June 26 & 27 at 6 PM. It could be a fun party at HQ or elsewhere. There was not much interest. From the Chairmen meeting: Franny Sharpe from the ADP, has requested time to speak to LD10 on August 21st. Her topics will be Arizona redistricting after the 2020 census, supporting Democrats for Corporate Commissioners, and delegate selection. Her goal is to speak with all LD groups. The Board would rather she speak with us after the elections, preferably in January. Bonnie will speak with her. Field Team 6 from Los Angeles is offering Arizona Democrats another tool for getting out the vote. They were successful in turning Orange County [Blue](#). Need volunteers for this endeavor. Outreach efforts - Nick Arnold and Susan DeHart - Capacity Building Team. There was a good turnout for the early Saturday morning canvassing from the Wilmot Library before the last Town Hall. There will be a 6/22 canvass. 18 volunteers have already committed to next Saturday's library outreach.

Opening statement at the libraries has been changed to 'inviting people to upcoming events or asking them to sign Dirty Money petition.' Marion Chubon asked if we have seen any results from our efforts thus far and Stephanie said it is still early days.

Treasurer- Marshall Coyne reported that we have \$7671.00 in our account. Need to remind people at our next meeting to pay their dues.

Corresponding Secretary - Rebecca Crow - Still reaching out to recruit new volunteers and PCs. We have new business cards at \$5.00/100. And we need 20 badges for volunteers to use when they are out canvassing.

Executive Committee - Greer Warren and Marion Chubon.

The 'Outlaw Dirty Money' initiative was endorsed by the Committee.

Reviewed a Strategic Plan for PCDP. June 14th is Tucson's Juneteenth celebration - celebrating the end of slavery in the US.

Allison Jones, PCDP Chair stated that there has been a request made for a \$2000.00 grant for an intern and for equipment. There was discussion around whether or not the EC meetings should be recorded. It was decided that with the exception of budget and strategic plans, meetings will be recorded.

Data Team Committee - Nick Arnold - Nick announced some canvassing incentives - LD10 pens for 1st canvas and a water bottle for the 3rd. There will be metrics for "door knockers," from #1 - good to #6 - totally useless.

There will be volunteer log-ins which will require volunteer data entry training. The 6/22 canvassing will hopefully be directed from the Territories. Developing a manual for every data lead and offering more VAN training.
