Projects Report: Andy Flach: For the PPE we bought voter rolls to see who changed from Independents to Democrats. The results were explained in depth. An expected result: face-to-face canvassing was the most successful with canvasser getting people to change while they were present. Handouts left for those not home did not appear to have much of an impact.

Final Results:

In person - 80% changed to Democrat

Would do on-line - 57% to Democrat

Will investigate - 29%

Not interested - 10% to Democrat

44% of voters changed to Democratic voters

PEVL Project Phase 1: Mike Weingarten: Because of Covid-19 we changed our methodology to protect ourselves and others. The purpose of this project is to increase the number of registered voters using the PEVL this year and beyond. Since upcoming elections may be by mail-in vote, it's important to sign up. We will be telephoning registered Democrats with a high Democratic score (90% or above) who

are not on PEVL. Mike and Bharathan trialed the process and generally, the outcome was positive. Use the mini VAN if possible. The script will be provided.
